LogistiCare Awarded Mississippi Medicaid Transportation Management Contract

ATLANTA – LogistiCare announced today that the state of Mississippi Division of Medicaid has awarded the company a contract to manage its statewide Medicaid non-emergency medical transportation (NEMT) program.

LogistiCare will manage transportation for Mississippi's 467,000 eligible beneficiaries. The contract is effective Nov. 1 and will run through June 30, 2009, with a one-year option to renew.

"I am very pleased that LogistiCare was selected to manage non-emergency medical transportation for Mississippi's eligible Medicaid beneficiaries," said John Shermyen, president and chief executive officer of LogistiCare. "This is a great opportunity for us to play a key role and to really make a positive difference in a state where access to healthcare is very important.

"By soliciting input from all stakeholders – the state, transportation providers and eligible Medicaid beneficiaries – LogistiCare will focus on improving the transportation services provided to beneficiaries while reducing system inefficiencies. We also will be helping the local economy by hiring about 50 state residents to staff our Jackson call center and Oxford regional office."

LogistiCare will manage the program from a call center in Jackson, and it will operate a regional office in Oxford. Management services provided by LogistiCare include eligibility screening, trip scheduling and third-party contracting with local transportation companies, who provide the actual trip service. LogistiCare also handles provider reimbursement and quality assurance.

LogistiCare comes to Mississippi with a host of 2006 accomplishments, including URAC accreditation for quality. URAC's accreditation of LogistiCare marks the first award to a transportation broker and sets the standard for the rest of the industry. In addition to the quality accreditation, the company was awarded the contract to manage Philadelphia County's Medical Assistance Transportation Program, re-awarded the Medicaid NEMT contract in Colorado; and

the company received an early contract renewal in Missouri. In 2005 LogistiCare won its first NEMT contract in Missouri and was re-awarded key NEMT contracts in Virginia, Kentucky and Florida. The company also earned contract extensions in Nevada, Oklahoma, Delaware and Connecticut. LogistiCare also manages non-emergency contracts for managed care organizations in Florida, Ohio, Connecticut, Pennsylvania, Maryland, Texas and the District of Columbia.

Under LogistiCare's management, states have seen costs for NEMT continue to decrease, while overall healthcare spending has seen double-digit increases.

"We intend to work closely with all stakeholders to be partners in bringing quality, reliability and confidence to Mississippi's Medicaid NEMT program," Shermeyen added.
