LogistiCare Wins Philadelphia County Contract for Medicaid Transportation

ATLANTA – LogistiCare announced today that it has signed a contract with the Pennsylvania Department of Public Welfare to manage the Philadelphia County Medical Assistance Transportation Program (MATP).

LogistiCare will manage transportation for the county's 430,000 eligible Medicaid recipients. The contract period begins Dec. 1 and will run through 2009, inclusive of renewal options.

“LogistiCare is very pleased to have been selected to manage the MATP program for Philadelphia County's eligible Medicaid recipients,” said John Shermyen, president and chief executive officer of LogistiCare. “We're looking forward to bringing the same quality service, cost efficiencies and advanced technology to Philadelphia that our clients around the country know us for.”

LogistiCare comes to Philadelphia with a host of 2006 accomplishments, including receipt of URAC accreditation for quality. URAC's accreditation of LogistiCare marks the first award to a transportation broker and sets the standard for the rest of the industry.

In addition to the quality accreditation, the company was awarded the non-emergency medical transportation (NEMT) contract for Mississippi; it was re-awarded the NEMT contract in Colorado; and it received an early contract renewal in Missouri. In 2005 LogistiCare won the statewide NEMT contract in Missouri and was re-awarded key NEMT contracts for Virginia, Kentucky and Florida. It also earned contract extensions in Nevada, Oklahoma, Delaware and Connecticut. LogistiCare also manages non-emergency transportation programs for managed care organizations in Florida, Ohio, Connecticut, Pennsylvania, Maryland and the District of Columbia.

Under LogistiCare's management, states have seen costs for NEMT continue to decrease, while overall healthcare spending has seen double-digit increases.
