Through our Senior Mobility program, we hope to keep seniors active and feeling important in today's world."

Shermeyen did not reveal complete details of the planned program, but did indicate that its premise is based on LogistiCare's present operating structure as a transportation management company.

"We would work closely with nursing homes, senior communities and the like to make it a one-stop effort to arrange transportation for residents who want to be out and about," explained Shermeyen. "We have done it successfully for years for our non-emergency medical transportation clients, so I firmly believe that we can and will make this happen."

Shermeyen's confidence is bolstered by last year's successful transaction that saw Charterhouse Group, Summit Partners and AlInvest take the role as lead investors in LogistiCare's future growth.

"We have been extremely pleased working with our new investors," Shermeyen continued. "Knowing that we have some of the top investment partners in business today helping us grow gives me great reassurance that anything is possible for us in the very near future."
